
2022 OHS Valedictorian & Salutatorian

It's the time of year for celebrations in the Olean City School District! Commencement, grade advancement, senior nights for athletics, banquets, concerts and so much are happening throughout our school community. This newsletter provides merely a slice of life in our schools, and I am proud to report there is an abundance of reasons to celebrate.

We are grateful to have received strong support for our 2022-2023 school budget. Not only do we have a fiscally responsible spending plan that accounts for an increase to student programs and services, but we have a responsible district reserve plan and have accounted for continuing some services after federal funding disappears.

Administrators and instructional coaches have been assisting with the implementation of resources aligned to the next generation learning standards, and our students will be prepared for the new assessments as they come online. Common curricular pathways throughout our elementary and intermediate programs are to be expected with increased academic achievement for each student. Olean High School is developing a credit recovery program, which is a robust emergency room-style approach to intervene quickly when a student starts falling behind. A Muti-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) is being identified throughout the district, which will help staff, parents, and students understand the strategies and services we will apply in every grade and course.

This is also a good time for each of us to reflect on our past year. Staff review their professional performance and think about goals for the upcoming year. Students at every level can think of study habits they found successful and identify clubs or activities to join in the coming year. We are assessing our progress as we emerge from the pandemic, and making changes to address our greatest needs.

Your OCSD Board of Education has been at work updating the OCSD Policy Manual and searching for your permanent Superintendent of Schools, who is employed to oversee and carry out the policies. These are the two main functions of a board of education. Many hours have been devoted at the sacrifice of family and personal time for this volunteer position, as they research, read, listen, and learn before making final decisions.

On a personal note, it has been a pleasure serving as your Interim Superintendent of Schools. The past few months have flown by. Together we have tackled some pressing issues and made some adjustments to operations for improvement. I am confident that the talented faculty and staff of OCSD will remain on a trajectory of profound improvement for the terrific students we serve. Thank you for the opportunity to learn with you.



The New Farm to School Program

Greetings! My name is Michael Nelson. I am serving as the new Farm to School Educator for Olean City School District.

In 2020, OCSD received a \$48,325 Farm to School Grant from the United States Department of Agriculture. I have been contracted by the district through the Cornell Cooperative Extension of Cattaraugus County to help implement a Farm to School program with the grant.

Farm to School programs enrich student nutrition and learning by bringing local food to the lunchroom, facilitating school gardens, organizing farm field trips, and applying evidence based lessons about agriculture and food systems.

I am a Western New York transplant who fell in love with the region while studying at St. Bonaventure University where I graduated with a B.A. in journalism, minoring in environmental studies. My interest in nutrition advocacy and policy led me to pursue a master's degree in applied nutrition at Canisius College, which I will complete later this year.

I have also earned personal training certification through the National Academy of Sports Medicine and train at the Olean YMCA.

My educational choices reflect my beliefs about wellness: there are many components of wellness and the health of each component depends on the health of the others. I also simply love food—growing food, making food, eating food. I believe all foods fit within a healthy diet. One of my primary career goals is to help others find peace with food by encouraging meaningful connection to food through nutrition education and advocacy—which is inherent to the Farm to School mission.
